

The 6R's of Disclosure Response









RECOGNISE

- ✓ Listen without judgement
- ✓ Give the child your full attention
- ✓ Be patient

- X Ask leading questions
- X Interrupt or cut the child off
- Correct the child



REASSURE

- ✓ Thank the child for entrusting you
- Let the child know how brave they are for speaking with you
- Make promises you can't keep



RESPOND

- Explain what will happen next
- Let the child know who you will be informing and why
- Tell the child that you will keep it a secret
- Confront the perpetrator



REPORT

- Complete a report through your statebased reporting scheme
- Report to your line manager

X Notify parents/guardians unless advised by your state-based helpline



RECORD

- Document the conversation and disclosure
- Include only the facts
- Complete an incident report

- X Leave out information
- X Change language used by the child or young person
- X Add emotions or opinions



REFLECT

- ✓ Think about the steps you took and what you could do differently next time
- Think about how you can use this experience to better inform the children
- X Tell your friends or other children about the incident
